## Coca-Cola Bottlers Japan installs "Shimanami Kaido Cycling Road Support Vending Machine" in the precinct of Ooyama Shrine (Bicycle Shrine)

A new design wrap of the cycling manga "Long Rider Stories!" appears

On Friday, November 20, Coca-Cola Bottlers Japan Inc. (Headquarters in Minato-ku, Tokyo; Representative Director & President Calin Dragan; hereafter "CCBJI") installs a "Shimanami Kaido Cycling Road Support Vending Machine" in the precinct of Ooyama Shrine (Habu-cho, Innoshima, Onomichi), which is the only "bicycle shrine" in Japan.

The "Shimanami Kaido Cycling Road Support Vending Machine" to be installed this time in the precinct of Ooyama Shrine has a new wrap design featuring the cycling manga "Long Rider Stories!" (Note 1), in which Shimanami Kaido Cycling Road appears. This is the 9th support vending machine for us (Note 2). We will donate part of our proceeds from this vending machine to Shimanami Kaido Cycling Road Promotion Council Hiroshima Headquarters (Note 3) to help continue to keep the Shimanami Kaido Cycling Road toll free.

## (Note 1) "Long Rider Stories!"

## (Note 2)

The first vending machine was installed in July 2014 in the Onomichi rest area of Onomichi Bridge (Mukaihigashi-cho, Onomichi, Hiroshima).

(Note 3) Shimanami Kaido Cycling Road Promotion Council Hiroshima Headquarters This was established with the main purpose of continuing to keep the Shimanami Kaido Cycling Road toll free in June 2014. It is composed of members of Hiroshima Prefecture and Onomichi City, and Tourism Section of Hiroshima Prefecture serves as its Secretariat. In June 2014, we entered into an agreement with Shimanami Kaido Cycling Road Promotion Council and have installed support vending machines since then as one of the initiatives to make the toll for bicycles to cross the six bridges of Shimanami Kaido Cycling Road free (usually, a toll of 500 yen is charged).
